




- #1: PET bottles and boxes e.g. Soda and water bottles
- #2: HDPE bottles e.g. Milk and laundry detergent bottles
- #3: PVC bottles e.g. Health and beauty products
- #4: LDPE containers e.g. vegetable oil and margarine tubs
- #5: PP containers e.g. Yogurt, syrup, and ketchup bottles
- #6: Styrofoam, polystyrene e.g. Meat trays, egg cartons, packing peanuts. These **cannot** be recycled.
- #7: Other e.g. Narrow neck containers
